MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 5, CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA

Meeting convened at 6:00 p.m. on October 22, 2024, at First State Bank Nebraska, second floor community room, 446 Main Street, Plattsmouth Nebraska. Attached hereto are: the agenda for the meeting; the Affidavit of Printer verifying that notice of the meeting, stating the availability of the Agenda, was published in the *Omaha World-Herald*, a newspaper of general circulation in Cass County, Nebraska; advance notice of the meeting as provided to the County Clerk of Cass County and all Trustees; and the Trustees' acknowledgment of receipt of said notice and agenda. All proceedings were taken while convened with attendance open to the public.

ITEM 1

The Chair called the Meeting to order at 6:06 p.m.

ITEM 2

The Chair announced the locations of the Open Meetings Act and the documents related to the agenda items.

ITEM 3

Roll Call: Present: Jennifer Sommer, Kurt Meisinger, Frank Gorhau Jr., John Bolton and David L. Martin. Absent: None.

ITEM 4

No persons appeared to address the Board as part of open session for public comment.

ITEM 5

Motion by Meisinger seconded by Gorhau to recommend that the County Board of Commissioners approve an administrative subdivision of Lot 8R, being a replat of original Lots 8 and 9, Block 23, Buccaneer Bay Subdivision, Cass County, Nebraska and to authorize the Chair to sign the mylar. ITEM 7a

Trustee Martin provided a Utilities Committee Report and advised that a water system Pressure Reducing Valve had failed on Friday about noon, resulting water pressures at some locations reaching as high as 170 PSI, had been replaced; the water and wastewater treatment facilities have been winterized; water tower maintenance has been completed; cables and wires located inside the tower have been reorganized; and the results of the lead service line report will be submitted to the State by the end of the week.

ITEM 7b

Mr. Johnson advised that he had received PeopleService Water/Wastewater & billing report in the afternoon but was not in the office to print it for the meeting.

ITEM 7c

Following some discussion of a proposal from HOA to provide Cyber Protection Information Technology services for the water/wastewater infrastructure, the Chair laid the matter over to the next meeting for further consideration and possible action.

ITEM 7d

No action was necessary following discussion of the right-of-way agreement requested by the City of Plattsmouth which includes construction of a rock equipment route down the centerline of the Treasure Island Rd right- of-way west of the current end of the paved cul-de-sac for the purpose of accessing the properties on which the city will construct a portion of a water main from Metropolitan Utilities District's well field on the north side of the Platte River to Plattsmouth.

Trustee Bolton provided the attached Roads and Storm Water Management Committee Report. Trustee Bolton also asked that the agenda for the next meeting include discussion of the roads

maintenance project for the summer of 2025.

Motion by Martin, seconded by Gorhau to award a 2-year contract, with the District having an option for an additional (3RD) year, to MADs Lawn and Landscape incorporating the list of equipment into the Exhibit A: "Complete List of Snow Removal Equipment" as required in the Request for Proposals. Be It Further Resolved by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 5 of Cass County, Nebraska that both the Board and the District find and determine, and covenant and warrant, and agree that (a) the facilities for which the above Warrants are issued are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; (b) there are no persons with rights to use said facilities other than as members of the general public; (c) ownership and operation of said facilities is with the District or another political subdivision; (d) none of the proceeds of the Warrants will be loaned to any person and to the extent that special assessments have been or are to be levied for any said facilities, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefitted by such facilities in the District; (e) the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use; (f) the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public is proceeding with reasonable speed and (g) the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chair or Clerk to file, when due, an Information Reporting Form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 pertaining to the above Warrants.

Be It Further Resolved by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 5 of Cass County, Nebraska that the District covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of

more than \$10,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

Be It Further Resolved by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 5 of Cass County, Nebraska that this and the preceding Resolutions are adopted as the Certificate with Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and Chair and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Cass County, Nebraska, as follows:

- 1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. This District reasonably anticipates that moneys in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the lesser of: (a) 10% of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) 125% of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such moneys. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such moneys, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above warrants.
- 2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.
- 3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.
- 4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148-2(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

On roll call those voting aye: Sommer, Gorhau, Meisinger, Martin and Bolton. Voting nay: none. Absent: None. Abstaining: none. The Chair declared the resolution adopted.
