Getting to know Buc Bay residents

Early settlers dodged 2019 flood

hen Zach and Nancy Utecht decided to move to Buccaneer Bay 35 years ago, they didn't have to worry about selling their Springfield home. They simply had it lifted and hauled to their lot on Treasure Island Road.

The prefab structure made the trip in good shape and became one of the first to reside on the long stretch of road north of Buccaneer Boulevard. They recall there were only about five houses there when they settled in.

"Treasure Island Road used to be a dirt road," Nancy said. "That dirt road was a rough one."

Vehicles still had to cross the tracks in those early vears, but there was no blinking crossing guard like today to warn vehicles of an approaching train.

So how did the married couple of 41 years end up as one of the early settlers of our little community? Both have Midwest roots, although Zach came to the area from a farther distance. His family uprooted from Wakefield in northeast Nebraska to Papillion, where he eventually graduated from Papillion High School in 1982.

Nancy was raised on a farm — first near Bellevue and later a farm near Platteview High School, where she graduated. Both attended Metro Community College, but they didn't know each other.

"I studied as a dental assistant, and he did auto body repair," Nancy said. "We say we were both in high school together, even though we weren't in the same high school."

They eventually were introduced to each other by a mutual friend while attending the Sarpy County Fair.

"Zach tried to impress me by riding a bull," Nancy said, laughing. "That wasn't the best move.

"He pursued me for about three months, and I kept saying I just wanted to be friends. He said he wanted to be more than friends."

They exchanged wedding vows in 1983. The couple doesn't have children of their own, but they enjoy spending time with many of their nephews and nieces.

Said Zach: "We're called favorite aunt Nancy and uncle Zach."

Nancy worked as a dental assistant in Omaha for 34 years before retiring. Today she keeps busy serving as a

Visiting Angel giving home care to the elderly.

Zach was an above-average baseball player in high school, and he received interest from a couple of smaller Nebraska colleges. But his heart back then was set on becoming an auto body repair specialist.

He's been in that business ever since finishing at Metro. He first picked up experience with Thorpe's Body Shop in Papillion (which is still open today).

"We became very good friends," Zach said. "We liked the whole family, and I liked working there."

Today, Zach works at Offutt Collision Repair in Bellevue, just east of Kennedy Freeway. He's been there for 19 years.

When time allowed, the couple has taken trips, both close and far away, as well as a couple of cruises. Their travels have taken them to Mexico, Jamaica and even Hawaii. They have nieces and nephews in Florida that they visit when they can. Zach said he prefers to drive since they often bring along their dog.

They rank the Hawaii trip as their hands-down favorite.

"There were all those flowers, and no bugs," Nancy said.

Since moving here, the Utechts have dealt with the usual weather issues, severe storms, the 2017 tornado and, the most nerve-racking of all, the 2019 flood that caused massive damage to homes on the two Buc Bay lakes. They left town the day the nightmare began.

"We went to a wedding in Florida," Nancy recalled, "and everyone was sending me videos of how close it was getting to our house. I was a nervous wreck. When we got back, we found out the water stopped right by our garage. It got up to our second tie wall. Thank God is all I can say."

They did take some preparations before leaving, specifically, placing valuable paperwork higher up just in case water did enter their home.

Others on their block weren't as fortunate.

"We had neighbors who lost their patio windows," Nancy said. "They had fish in their basement. The water pressure broke their patio door."

One thing that came out of the huge clean-up was how the neighbors rallied around each other.

"Everybody pulled together," Zach said. "A bad thing happened and turned into a good thing."

Zach and Nancy have spent many years attending Papillion Days and the parade that highlights the weekend. They became friends with the owner of the Parkside Bar, and when it was demolished long ago, Zach was given the sign that was attached to the side of the building.

Moving to Buccaneer Bay, they both agree, was a blessing.

"It was the best thing we've ever done," Zach said.

Added Nancy: "We loved it from the beginning. We loved seeing the deer in the back, the animals and the lake."

Zach is an avid deer hunter, and on display inside their home are trophies of various prized kills. He usually hunts near Arthur, northwest of North Platte, where a nephew lives. They enjoy cooking the processed meat during winter months.

Over the years, more and more homes filled in the Bay Lake area. For Zach and Nancy, that meant making new friends.

"We love our neighbors," Nancy said. "I feel like it's a little community."

Hydrant Painting – Estimated start date: Sept. 29. Work should continue for two to three weeks

The District has hired a contractor to paint all of the fire hydrants in the District. This is being done to control corrosion and to properly mark the hydrants per industry standards.

Over the past few weeks the District has performed flow testing of all hydrants. The results of that testing determines the color that will be applied to the top of the hydrant. The color applied to the top of the hydrant lets the fire department know how much water they can expect the hydrant to deliver.

Impact to Residents

Workers will be accessing residents yards multiple times until the fire hydrant is fully painted.

Any custom paint schemes that have been applied by residents will be lost.

Giving neighbor left us too soon

When we moved to Buccaneer Bay — specifically, Lakeside Drive's new duplexes/townhomes on July 1, 2017 — I was "just" 64 years old. I didn't give much, if any, thought about the fact our block would be inhabited by older neighbors (I tried to not think of myself in that category).

When you have elderly around, you eventually lose them. Sadly, it's happened twice on our block, the most recent coming just over a month ago with the death of Mark Pellettera.

We lost our first neighbor, John Stewart, in 2018. He and wife Linda moved



in a couple doors down just a few months after us. John was an Air Force pilot, and all those years in the cockpit took a toll on his back. And that contributed to his death at age 87.

Wife Shirley and I were getting better acquainted with John and Linda, and then he was gone. I still wish I would have had a chance to spend more time with him.

Within the next year, two more couples joined our block — Mike and Diane Despit and Mark and Mary Pellettera. They moved into their duplex on the same weekend, and we were excited to meet the newcomers.

With each passing month, we learned more about the two couples. Diane and Mary were members of the Omaha Bryan Class of 1970 (the same year Shirley and I graduated from Papillion High).

Mark caught me a bit off guard the day we met him and Mary. Mark asked if we would mind not turning on our outdoor porch and garage lights at night. I thought that was a bit strange until I soon learned his hobby was astronomy. He owned the largest telescope I'd ever seen in person, and it came out any-

time he wanted to share his knowledge of the stars and planets. It was a better education than I ever got in college.

As time marched on, I would get to

know a little more about Mark. He was as tech-savvy as anybody on our block, and that came in handy when it came to needing help with an app that would allow me to open and close our garage door using my

phone. (Yes, we had the remote attached to the side of the garage, but this was, in my opinion, a cooler way to do it.)

When I hit a snag setting up the app, Mark dropped everything to come over and help figure it out.

Mark knew Amazon's Alexa better than anyone I knew. Case in point: He was able to get Alexa to turn every light on in their home.

Once while talking to Mark about our son having suffered a stroke (he was in his 40s at the time), he in a matter-offact tone said he could relate, having endured multiple strokes in the past. (After his death, Mary said one of the strokes was serious enough she thought he wasn't going to come out of it.)

We all were concerned about Mark's health, but that didn't seem to slow him down a bit. Just a week before his death, I watched him spray his front yard for weeds.

In the days following the shocking news of his passing, we discovered Mark was an organ donor. That didn't surprise me at all, because that was typical of the man who shared so much of his time and talent.

Adding to my sorrow for him was that he left us less than a week after announcing his retirement. Mark was just 66.

He left us way too soon, and he will be forever missed.





SID#5 Covenants - Architectural Control

The Buccaneer Bay Architectural Control process of reviewing requests for changes on your property is now being managed by Teresa Dilts and Kayla Graff. They will be working with Mike Jensen, Cass County Zoning Administrator.

There are 8 sets of Covenants for Buccaneer Bay. It seems like every time a new section of Buccaneer Bay opened up another set of covenants was made. I try to make sure that every resident in Buccaneer Bay gets a copy of the covenants that is for their section of the neighborhood. Some realtors will provide a copy of the covenants to the buyer, but I don't think all of them do. Most of the covenants have some sort of termination clause.

All sets of covenants are filed at the Register of Deeds office at the Court House. Not all of the covenants have the same number of years that the covenants are in force.

HILLS COVENANTS in the second section titled: "AMENDED DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS", which covers the following: These covenants shall run with the land and be binding upon the current and future Owners of all Lots in Blocks One (1) through Six (6), inclusive; all Lots in Blocks Fifteen (15) through Twenty (20), inclusive; Lots one (1) through Five (5) in Block Seven (7), and; Lot Ten (10) in Block Fourteen (14), all in Buccaneer Bay, a subdivision as surveyed, platted and recorded in Cass County, Nebraska, until the year 2029, together with any Lots created by a replat of these Lots, and shall be continued for successive periods of twenty-five (25) years unless sooner modified or terminated in writing by seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the then record owners of the Properties, with one vote per Lot.

BAY LAKE COVENANTS in the second section titled: "AMENDED DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS", which covers the following Blocks: Block 21, 22, 23, 24, and 26 until the year 2000, at which time the covenants shall be extended for *successive terms* of 25 years, which should make them good until 2025.

Block 31 in Buccaneer Bay incudes Windward Dr. and all side streets in this section, approved in September 2008 for term of 25 years, which would then expire in 2033.

Blk 28 Lots 8A/B, Lots 9A/B, and Lot 10 on Lakeside Dr. These first 2 townhomes and one house are under the original covenants for Lakeside Dr. approved May 18, 2005 for a term of 25 years, which should terminate in 2030.

Blk 28, Lots 1A – 24B, minus Lots 8A/B, 9A/B and Lot 10 on Lakeside Dr. as described in the Covenants from Lone Tree Holdings. Approved May 18, 2017 for a term of 30 years, which would terminate in 2047.

Bucc Bay 1st Edition – Lots 1R – 39R – Davy Jones Dr. and Davy Jones Cir. Filed February 14, 1996 for a term of 25 years. These Covenants have expired.

Blk 29 Lots 1-26 Fairway Cir., Blk 30 Lots 1-6 – Fairway Dr. – Covenants and restrictions shall run with and bind the land and for a term of twenty-five years. Filed May 18th, 2005, which would expire in 2030.

Blk 27 Lots 1A – 20B, and Lots 21 – 62 – Sailboat Lake – The Covenants and restrictions shall run with and bind the land for a term of 25 years. Filed December 23, 1996, the Covenants have been renewed.

Residents under the covenants that will be expiring can be renewed by having residents who want to have the covenants continue review and update them. Each set of covenants has a specification of how many signatures are required to approve the revised covenants. It has been done, but it takes a lot of work. Once the covenants are out of date, that section of residents will no longer have to follow any restrictions for their section.

Note: The process below may be modified as the Newsletter and Welcome Packages are being updated.

Each time a new resident moves in they receive a Welcome Package that has a copy of the covenants for their location. The information on new residents come in an email from Peoples Service. Jill Bobenhouse-Teaser will take on putting the Welcome Packages together and provide the packages to the appropriate Block Captain so the new resident can fill out a Data Sheet to be sent to one of the members taking over for Janet. The changes will require the new information to be added to the Buccaneer Bay Phone Directory, if the new resident approves, and update the Block Captains list as residents move in and out.
